

Brighton & Hove Living Wage Campaign September 2019 Survey

We asked employers currently signed up to the Brighton & Hove Living Wage Campaign about their experiences. 40 businesses completed the survey.

The Brighton & Hove Living Wage Campaign encourages local businesses to pay all employees the Living Wage, currently. The campaign is led and managed by Brighton Chamber, with nearly 600 businesses, social enterprises, charities and public sector organisations signed up.




Joining the Brighton & Hove Living Wage Campaign directly led to an increase in employees' wages

20% of the businesses that responded to the survey said joining the campaign directly led to an increase in employees' wages. 72.5% said joining the campaign did not directly lead to an increase. 7.5% didn't know.



The rate

The Living Wage rate is calculated annually by the Resolution Foundation using the best available data. This City is an expensive area to live, with higher than average housing costs and lower than average salaries. For this reason we always encourage employers to sign up and commit to paying the Living Wage or more. In our survey this year we asked employers if it was felt £9.00 per hour (which was the rate at the time of the survey) is enough to live on - 27.5% said that it should be more for Brighton & Hove.



The impact of paying the Living Wage **POSITIVE FOR STAFF**

75% of employers we surveyed told us that paying the Living Wage has had a positive impact on their staff.




IMPORTANT FOR BUSINESS



When asked about the specific ways in which the Living Wage impacts business, respondents said:

- **47.5%** good staff morale
- **20.0%** high levels of staff productivity
- **30.0%** strong employee retention
- 40.0% help with recruitment
- **35.0%** positive PR
- **20.0%** all of the above
- 17.5% no impact
- 10.0% other












Supply chain


55% of those surveyed said that they consider whether or not a supplier for their business is a Living Wage employer.

We asked the Living Wage employers if they would have joined the Brighton & Hove Living Wage Campaign if there had been a charge to sign up: **2.5%** said yes, they would; **45%** said no, they wouldn't; **47.5%** said it would depend on how much it wouldcost and **5%** said they were unsure.
